The Rector writes

Once a fortnight, I go into Maresfield and Nutley schools to lead worship/assembly. This term we are (surprise surprise) thinking about the Easter story.



This week (as I write) we are thinking about the different reactions to Jesus on the cross. In chapter 15 of Mark's gospel, we have several reactions recorded for us. Some of the children will be dressing up (if my Amazon order arrives) as the people who were there:

A busy soldier

Roman soldiers put Jesus on the cross. They just saw him as another criminal. They mocked him as a king, yes, but in the end, they did their job and cast lots for his clothes, as they would anyone else. Jesus meant nothing to them.

A religious leader

The religious leaders of the day saw Jesus as someone to be mocked. Jesus had claimed to be the Messiah and had healed others. "He saved others", they said, but he can't save himself." In that moment they felt vindicated in their decision to have him arrested. He was no messiah, just a man to be mocked.

A member of the crowd

Several in the crowd mocked Jesus. One ran up, gave Jesus a drink of wine vinegar and then waited to see if a miracle would occur. He was there for the show – hoping for something miraculous, though showing no sign of faith.

A Roman centurion

In stark contrast was the Roman centurion. He watched Jesus die and, weighing up everything he had seen, declared "surely this man was the Son of God." In that moment, he believed Jesus' claims about himself. In many ways, he was the last person you would expect to respond like this.

Indifference, mockery, there for the show and – finally – worship.

It's amazing that Mark records all these responses. It's thought Mark did this, not only to record details of what happened, but to get us thinking. Who do I say Jesus is? Have I thought about what all this means? There is no question more important.

I also love the fact it was the Roman Centurion who was able see what he saw. It reminds us that there is no such thing as the 'right' type of person to be a Christian. Jesus calls all to follow him.



As springtime arrives to our woodland, we would like to encourage people to visit and enjoy being outdoors. The health benefits of being in woodlands have proven to reduce stress levels, improve your mood, reduce anxiety, and improve your physical health.

During April we always have a wonderful display of bluebells so please feel free to come and visit and enjoy!

If you are looking for something to do with your kids over the Easter holidays, why not come along and feed our ducks? We are fortunate to have three pairs of mallard ducks on the ponds at present. They are likely to be nesting soon so please be sensitive and offer them some food if you like.

Here is a handy guide for food that is good to offer:

Sweetcorn - tinned, frozen or fresh is fine, just make sure you defrost frozen corn.

Lettuce - all types of salad leaves are fine, as long as it hasn't gone slimy.

Peas - no need to cook them, but allow frozen peas to defrost before feeding them to ducks.

Oats – rolled oats and even instant porridge oats are fine to feed ducks. You could even feed them small pieces of flapjack, as long as there isn't too much added sugar.

Seeds - bird seed or supermarket-bought seeds for human consumption are fine. Seeds are very nutritious and will be snapped up.

Rice - both cooked and uncooked rice is fine.

Hidden in a south London park you can find dinosaurs! Created in 1850s, these Grade I listed architectural structures represented the cutting edge of



knowledge of dinosaurs and marine reptiles in the 19th century.

Palaeontologists had only just coined the name Dinosaur, and with limited fossil bones, they began their journey to discover how these extinct animals looked.

Aaron will tell us how the professors and fossil hunters such as Mary Anning and Gideon Mantell found fossils and created the reconstructions, even dining inside one of the massive models for a New Year's Eve party in 1853.

As a palaeontologist, he is an expert on fossils and prehistoric life from the first animals to appear on our planet to the evolution of early humans. PROTECT OUR VILLAGES

NO to a Planning Application for an expanded Ashdown Business Park

This application surfaced publicly in January. It seeks a new business park of 77 acres with 52 acres covered by 60,000 square metres of business units. The figures are difficult to envisage, but it is huge.

It will generate a lot of extra traffic over the next 10 years and adversely affect the landscape and overall environment, including ancient woodland and the Shortbridge stream.

Most importantly it will destroy the village environment we all treasure so much. We must work together to resist it.

NO to 2000 houses at Owlsbury Farm

Only today (March 10th) have I been briefed by the sponsors of a planning application in its very early stages, but with an outline plan to build about 2,000 houses with a school and a sports park at Owlsbury Farm. This land stretches from Little Horsted to Buckham Hill.

If this comes forward it will ruin rural North Wealden for ever. It will be a carbuncle on the side of Uckfield. We must resist this too.

Applications of this size and impact should only be considered as part of a formal Local Plan on which there must by law be extensive consultation. We must say no to these developments concreting over our villages and fields.

Grey Squirrel

I'm crouching behind my sofa, hiding from a squirrel. While I'm here, peering angrily out of the patio window, it has given me time to reflect on the emotional journey that led me to this place.

There was a time I was nuts about squirrels. As soon as I could walk, I was out shrieking through the autumn leaves, trying to grab a squirrel's bushy tail as it nimbly skedaddled up the nearest sycamore. Looking back now, I'm not sure what I planned to do with a squirrel, had I ever caught one. It's actually illegal to release a grey squirrel once caught because, despite their cute appearance, they can be extremely destructive.

The main problem is that they shouldn't really be in Britain. The grey squirrel is a North American species – and we can blame Herbrand Russell, 11th Duke of Bedford, for inviting them. Herbrand's hare-brained plan was to import grey squirrels to embellish his estate at the start of the last century. Distributing squirrels as gifts, he and his landowner chums assisted their spread across England. Our wildlife and landscape just weren't designed to accommodate this brash new American and the native red squirrel, already in decline, was hit particularly hard. Attempts have been made over the years to control Britain's grey squirrel population and protect the remaining reds, and the battle continues, but across most of England it seems the greys are here to stay.

In the last few weeks the battle has arrived in my back garden. I recently purchased



a bird feeding station an elaborate chandelier draped in peanut feeders. fat balls and coconut shells. Yet the nuthatches. tits and finches are being usurped by a grey squirrel. I'm paving pounds and getting peanuts and it's the squirrel who is packing his cheeks. It feels like I have laid on a buffet for my friends, only to find some American bloke (who I don't particularly like) has turned up to scoff the whole lot. For weeks. we have been locked in an ongoing arms race. I don't want to hurt him - I just



want him off my new bird feeder. I've deployed Vaseline, peppers and counterbalances but each time I've been outwitted. He is agile, acrobatic and very clever. Today I cracked. I purchased a squirrel proof baffle: a large Perspex dome, 100% guaranteed to make my peanut feeder impregnable. I installed it as the squirrel watched curiously and. with a confident laugh, I returned to my front room... to find the squirrel was already back on the peanut feeder. I have no idea how he's doing it and he's too smart to climb there if he's being watched. So here I am, behind the sofa, trying to find out his secret. Whether trying to beat

them nationally or just in our own back gardens, it really isn't reassuring to know we're being outsmarted by a rodent.
