William St John Kemm (Bill) 11th September 1939 – 25th October 2022

Bill Kemm was born in September 1939 to Rupert and Katherine, a war-time baby in the village of Cheddar where his father was the much loved local doctor. He was the eldest of three with his two brothers, Dick and John. Theirs was a country life; hens in the garden, going for walks exploring the Mendip hills, pot holing and cycling. At 13 he went to Dean Close School in Cheltenham, where he enjoyed the academic school life and being part of a Christian community.

In 1957, Bill went to Birmingham University to study Theology, there he met Jean. Bill trained to be a vicar at Ridley Hall Cambridge and in 1964 was ordained deacon at Lichfield Cathedral. Later that year he and Jean were married in the village Church of Mathon under the Malvern Hills.

Bill began his ministry as a Curate in Holy Trinity Church Wordsley on the edge of the Black Country. There wasn't a phone in their smart new house. It was there that Mary was born. His vicar was strict, making his first curacy rather challenging at times.

In 1968, Bill with Jean and baby Mary moved as a curate to the parish of Rawnsley on Cannock Chase. The nearby pit had recently been closed and there was a problem with the houses subsiding. Bill learnt to communicate with people very different to himself, bringing Christian comfort to the community when it was under great stress. This was where the tradition of Bill and Jean's summer garden parties began.

The family grew to include baby Peter and they moved to Hanbury and the Church of St Werburgh with Draycott in the Clay, in the countryside of North Staffordshire. As a new young vicar, Bill was independent for the first time, really participating in community life and experienced great joy in leading church services. The family lived in an enormous vicarage where Sarah was born. Bill worked with the youth group called the Adventurers who would often play in the extensive grounds. Bill edited the village magazine and also took Christmas cards to every home in the villages.

Bill relocated to a new parish in Somerset in 1976, where he could be close to his parents. He became vicar of St Mary's Church Berrow and St Bridget's Brean. The whole family blossomed there by the seaside. Bill led an active and growing congregation, enjoyed being part of a coastal community and felt fulfilled in delivering God's work.

After 16 years, Bill was offered All Saints Church Hertford, and made a life-changing decision, going from village life and small medieval churches to a vast Victorian church in a town, north of the M25. With a magnificent choir and established congregation, there he encountered problems and great opportunities. He loved to support the choir but they appreciated it when he didn't sing! Bill had firm views and stuck to his guns to ensure the longevity of both the church and church hall.

Retiring in 2006, Bill and Jean started a new adventure in Nutley, and had time to explore the world. They got onto a plane for the first time to visit his brother Dick, in China before setting forth to New Zealand, Australia and twice to the church at Mengnanapuram in South India where his great, great Grandfather was a much loved missionary. Bill wrote his biography – the family would like to give copies to anyone who is interested

Bill was a writer – he edited the parish magazine from Hanbury days to Nutley, only a few years ago. He loved his stamp collecting, a hobby from childhood. He also enjoyed reading historical books and novels. He would often be seen out on his bicycle or walking in the Ashdown Forest with the dogs Harry and later Lucy.

Bill had a strong Christian faith which went beyond leading services as he devoted many hours to visiting the elderly, sick and bereaved, caring for individuals and sharing the love of God. Jean has been bowled over by the messages of sympathy which share stories of his good deeds that she was unaware of, even in Nutley when he was retired. Jean would like to thank you to all for your kindness, care and love.

Local Government Update



Electric Vehicle charging points are due to be installed in Wealden District Council car parks in the coming months.

Feasibility work has been underway at a number of car parks across the Wealden district by the council's chosen provider, Connected Kerb, an electric vehicle charging contractor.

As part of phase one, Connected Kerb is currently reviewing 10 council owned and operated car parks for charging feasibility with the potential to expand to an additional 22 sites throughout Wealden in subsequent phases.

The first phase of locations includes Lower Road, Forest Row; The Willows, Alfriston; Croft Road, Crowborough; Mill Road, Heathfield; Luxford Road, Uckfield; North Road, Pevensey Bay; Greyhound, Wadhurst: and Horse Fields, East Dean.

Also included in this first phase are bays in the Vicarage Lane car park in Hailsham and bays in the South Road car park, also in Hailsham.

The installations are part of the council's ongoing efforts to support the transition to low carbon transport and to improve local air quality. The aspiration is that all residents who drive electric vehicles (EVs), or are considering making the switch, have convenient access to EV charging.

Within Wealden there are currently 23 EV charge points distributed throughout the district and the council recognises the need to provide additional public charge points for residents – particularly as 24% of households with a vehicle park on the street overnight.

At the heart of Wealden District Council's climate emergency declaration sits the requirement to transform its transport systems to low and zero emission alternatives, with the intention of working toward net-zero CO2 by 2050 or earlier for both the council and the Wealden district area.

In 2020, transport emissions account for 44.9% of total Wealden district emissions -16.5% higher than the national average.

Town and parish councils will be invited to a webinar in the near future to ask questions and develop understanding around electric vehicle charging.

New Highways Contractor for East Sussex Announced

Balfour Beatty Living Places Ltd has been awarded the County Council's new contract for highways and infrastructure services. The contract is valued at £297 million and will run for an initial seven years from May 1, 2023. There will be an option to extend this period to a maximum of 14 years, worth up to £730 million.

Balfour Beatty Living Places will be responsible for maintaining the county's highway network and infrastructure, as well as providing winter gritting and delivering highway improvement schemes. During the extensive procurement process, bidders were asked to demonstrate how they would support the County Council's efforts to reduce its carbon footprint, ensure quality of work, provide value for money and improve social wellbeing.

South East Business Initiative Programme Boosts Jobs and Profits

Since launching in July 2020, The South East Business Boost "Big Ambitions" programme has helped 85 businesses within East Sussex. The project has helped businesses in a variety of sectors, including personal grooming and food and drink.

From those enrolled in the programme, 55 businesses reported an increase in total

turnover of £5.5 million, as well as the creation of 48 new jobs. The programme is part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund and East Sussex County Council. It is delivered by Digital Islands and provides advice from subject experts.



Windows 11: a worthy successor?

As windows 11's painful early months fade into the painful present, are its shiny new features sufficient to offset Microsoft's all-too-evident efforts to stamp their preferences on your digital life?

Windows 11 has been bland enough that many people did not realise that they had been upgraded. New goodies include enhanced dictation with automatic punctuation; desktop layouts that remember where you like to see your apps; the opportunity to use some Android apps and other cute touches. Yet balancing this, Microsoft has emasculated the built-in File History backup, hidden or eliminated useful features, and pushed their choices as The Way.

A couple of trivial examples... Suppose you want to change the default web browser from Microsoft's Edge to, say, Firefox. This now involves several minutes of ferreting out and clicking numerous choices. By contrast, returning Edge to its default-browser throne is a single swift click. A similar enthusiasm to have things Microsoft's way strong-arms every home user into using a Microsoft account with its enhanced tendency to share information with Microsoft.

If Windows 11 is about software sparkles, these are already available in Windows 10 in a neat Microsoft program called *PowerToys*. This name which neatly summarises Windows 11's *cage d'or*. Its direction of travel is defined by an enthusiasm for 'getting to know you' better and promoting Microsoft's control of your data and your computer.

Windows 10 support expires in October 2025. It will work beyond this but without the security software patches that Microsoft regularly issues. There is no hurry: the Windows 11 upgrade is enduringly available but be warned... Microsoft have decided to prevent it from working with many older computers and even a number of recent computers due to their strangely restrictive hardware requirements. As a result, perfectly capable computers with plenty of life left will be consigned to the rubbish tip... a rampant obsolescence that undermines Mr Gates' climate-change pan-beating.

Windows 11 is here to stay. You may prefer to dawdle your way towards it. This maximises the life of your current computer, allows Windows 11 to mature and gives you time to explore your options.




