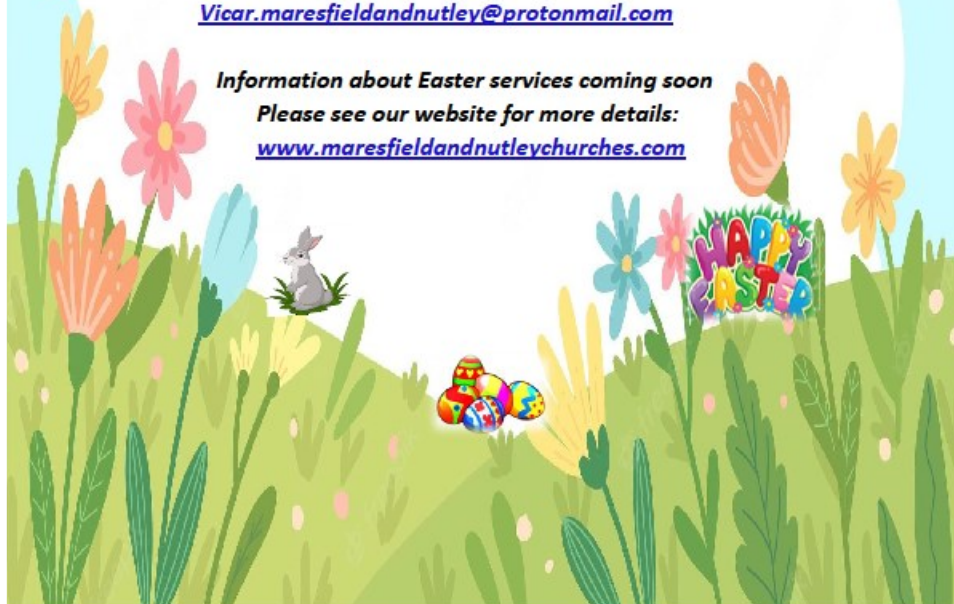

Local Update January 2023

The Local Plan

The Government are now consulting on changes to planning requirements.



The main proposed changes are -

- Centrally produced housing numbers will no longer be mandatory.
- With over 60% of Wealden being protected land, including the AONB, we can reduce the housing numbers required.
- Brownfield sites will be a priority.
- Planning Inspectors will no longer be able to override sensible local decisions.
- More homes will be built in the North and Midlands to ease pressure on the South-East.
- Local Neighbourhood Plans are to be strengthened
- Developers will pay higher fees so that Council planning departments are not subsidised by Council Tax payers.

The Consultation will continue until the Spring. As a result, Wealden will not be producing a formal Local Plan until after this process is completed. However, almost 8000 homes already have planning permission so any extra requirements are expected to be small-scale.

Roads

The weather has been dreadful and the roads are in a sorry state. This results from the wettest November ever, snow and ice for 10 days and then torrential rain. We should also invest more in our roads but the exceptional weather has been a big factor.

Potholes

There are some 2,400 defects reported in the system for attention, approximately 1,800 are potholes which is about 1,000 above normal operating levels. Resources have increased to 150% as well as working extended hours and weekends, and these resources will be kept at this level over the coming weeks.

Drainage/Flooding

The second highest category of reports / defects is for drainage and flooding problems. Again there are additional resources covering 24 hours a day.

Gritting

1,500 tones of salt are on order and awaiting delivery. County staff are continuing to refill grit bins.

Customer Contact

Highways have had almost twice the number of customer contacts during December (around 8,000) compared to previous years (4,500) but they have a full complement of customer service agents who are working overtime and weekends to process them. The Highway Stewards are also working overtime to help inspect and process cases as quickly as possible as well as undertake their statutory inspections.

Newsletter from Maresfield Parish Council - February 2023

A repeated word or two about Planning !



I make no apologies for reverting to “Planning” yet again as I believe once Wealden’s draft Local Plan is published this will be a main topic of discussion in Maresfield and it will prove to be very contentious for some Maresfield Village residents. Parishioners will be aware that Wealden District Council’s original draft Local Plan was withdrawn in early 2020 and consequently Wealden’s existing planning policies are deemed to be out of date. With less than a five-year housing land supply, no up to date Local Plan and Government policy favouring sustainable development Wealden is finding it

difficult to repel some developers’ ambitions.

We had hoped Wealden’s new draft Local Plan would have been published by now but it is further delayed as the Government has recently issued a planning consultation document which could influence Wealden’s approach and a delay will also be inevitable because of the forthcoming local elections in May.

When the draft Plan is published and open for consultation The Parish Council will organise local events to inform residents about the Plan and to hear residents’ views which will be taken into account in formulating the Parish Council’s formal response as well providing additional information for our Neighbourhood Development Plan team.

The Parish Precept

At the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 20th December the Parish Council resolved to approve the draft budget for 2023/24 in the amount of £102,922. This is an increase of 10.1% over the current year’s budget but of only 4.2% over the estimated expenditure for 2022/23.

After making adjustments to reserves the Parish Council resolved to set the Precept for 2023/24 at £99,892. Whilst this is an increase of 5.1% over the current year’s precept, due to an increase in the Council Tax base for Maresfield Parish, the increase per average Band D household is estimated to be just 2.7%.

Hedge cutting

Where you have hedges bordering on footpaths or the highway it is your (the property owner’s) responsibility to ensure that they do not encroach. Please inspect your hedges etc. and cut them back now, well before the nesting season when such action is not allowed.

The Marjory Pegg Award

It has been decided that no awards will be considered for this year and the Parish Council will decide at a future meeting how the Award scheme should function and its frequency.

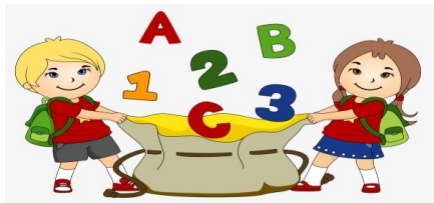

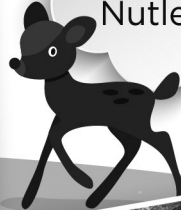

A smidgen of security

A quick review of standard procedure before looking at smartphones...

Passwords Memorable, easy and long are perfect password qualities such as ‘Cats-who-dribble3’. Unique is nice too. Do turn on the extra security features on your email accounts - other passwords can often be reset with access to email.

Security software Antivirus and adblocking are useful basic tools. Turn off notifications from your web browsers – do you really need to know what Granny had for breakfast?

Scare-ware Be suspicious of links in messages. ‘You’ve-been-hacked’ notifications are generally nonsense. If in doubt, turn off your router and seek independent advice.

Mobile phones Even when they are locked, mobiles often show the contents of new messages as they arrive. With no need to unlock your phone to read those ‘two factor’ messages, thieves have the potential to get their hands deeper into your data and money. Such convenience undermines your security.

You can easily prevent messages from appearing on the locked screen.

For **iPhones** this is done as follows: Settings > Messages > Notifications > Show Previews: select either ‘When Unlocked’ or ‘Never’.

On **Android**, the routine is typically: Settings > Lock Screen > Notifications: ‘Don't Show Notifications’.

However, that is only half the battle. Naturally a nimble-fingered creature of resource and determination, a thief may simply pop your phone’s SIM (the little card supplied by your mobile provider) into their own phone to gather your text messages and make calls. You can prevent this too by activating the locking code on your SIM...

Your SIM arrives with a default pin number called its PUK code. Armed with this you can set the pin code on an iPhone as follows: Settings > Mobile Data > SIM PIN.

On an Android, you will want these steps: Settings > Biometrics and security > Other security settings > Set up SIM card lock. There you can change the pin and activate the card lock.

And do remember your SIM pin code – you will want it occasionally...

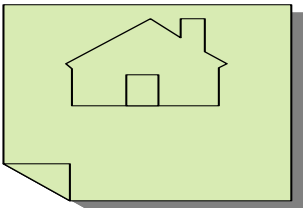

News From Ashdown Forest

February 2023

Defibrillator at the Forest Centre

Thanks to kind donations from East Grinstead Memorial Estate and The Friends of Ashdown Forest a public access defibrillator has been installed at the Forest Centre car park. The defibrillator is registered with The Circuit, which maps defibrillators across the UK so in the event they are required they can be accessed quickly.

Lloyd Richards, Chair of East Grinstead Memorial Estate, said “We are delighted to help fund this vital piece of equipment”.

Pat Arnold, Chair of The Friends of Ashdown Forest, added that it was a “great reassurance to have a defibrillator available to visitors of the Forest.”

Winter Works:

This winter contractors have been commissioned to remove scrub and gorse in various locations across the Forest. The main areas include at Bunkers Hill, at the Crow and Gate area of King's Standing, Hindleap, along the A275 near Reservoir car park, Vachery Drive and Greenwood Gate. This work is funded by the Countryside Stewardship Scheme.

The contractors are very experienced and ecologically sensitive, making sure that during the works all measures will be taken to avoid any unnecessary wildlife disturbance.

For everyone's health and safety, please follow any warning signs/instructions and keep dogs under close control whilst these works are being undertaken. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Why are we removing scrub?

Scrub is very important habitat for birds and invertebrates, but unfortunately without appropriate management, it will invade the heathland having a detrimental effect leading to the complete loss of this open habitat.

What about the wildlife that use the scrub?

We are undertaking this works during the winter, so not to impact on any nesting birds. Despite a large amount of scrub being removed from this area, there is an abundance of suitable habitat for wildlife to take refuge nearby and in the surrounding heathland.

Grazing Enclosures:

The three Exmoor pony enclosures are next to the Old Airstrip just off Long Car Park, at Crown of Thorns near Reservoir car park and at Jumpers near Chuck Hatch Lane. They will be there until spring. Please keep dogs under close control.

Nutley Windmill

First of all I wish your readers a Happy New year.

A great deal has happened to our mill in the last few months, those of you who have walked pass the mill will have noticed that she does not have any Sweeps on her. On 9th November last, while we were showing some visitors the Sweeps turning, one of them commented on the strange creaking sound. As we watch the sweep at the top started swaying and then crashed to the ground, fortunately no one was hurt. One of the 32 feet long Stocks which attach the Sweeps to the Mill had broken, a mixture of decayed wood, knots and recent high winds had contributed. In 1984 the same thing happened, actually at that time Thames Television were filming a children's series Chock's Children. That repair was in the hundreds but this one will be in the £10,000 plus range. It could not have come at a worst time after two years of very few donations due to Covid we had just had our first years full year of open days we were just looking towards a better future when this happened and now we have to go flat out fund raising. The Conservators of Ashdown Forest have started their car parking charges, which as we sign their Friends car park for our visitors is bound to adversely effect our donations from our visitors.

We have ordered new two 32 feet Oak timber for new stocks, which we hope to get at the end of this month January. We would like to have the repairs completed before Summer.

We are still working there on Wednesdays and so are pleased to welcome visitors to the mill, it is particularly good time at the moment with the work we are doing and pleased if any one would like to volunteer to help us.

Our first open day of this season in on Sunday 26th March 2.30 to 5.30pm. Still free admission, donations welcome
