The Rector writes

Happy New Year! I hope that you were able to enjoy Christmas with friends and family.

As a new year begins, many of us will be thinking about

the future. Of course, as the last three years have shown, we often know very little about what will come!

In the church calendar, the New Year begins with a time called Epiphany. We don't use that word too often, but it means that something has been revealed, or realised. We say, "I've had an epiphany!" Christians celebrate that, in a world of unknowns, God has made amazing things known.







Desktop, mobile - or both?

Tiny portable computers that fit in your pocket are now available. Remarkably forgiving of daily abuse, you can use them in the rain or drop them on concrete. With just a little protective foresight and a suitable model, these mini wonders carry on working and barely crash. They are, of course, mobile phones.

As mobiles become increasingly powerful, the distinction with desktop computers' capabilities is becoming less pronounced for browsing, writing, watching and listening. Is it time to wish your chunky PC or Mac goodbye? Let's take a look.

Getting started is easy. A number of mobile manufacturers offer desktop facilities. In Samsung's phones this is 'Dex'. Turn on this desktop mode, attach a screen, keyboard and mouse, and you find yourself looking at something surprisingly like Windows. Email, web browser, word processor, music and photos are all there.

Does it really work? Well, I am writing this using a full-size keyboard and a TV-size screen attached to a phone. The phone is playing music while the occasional email flitters in. It looks and feels like a normal computer.

Software for phones has improved - and there is plenty of it. As well as your preferred choice of browser or email program, there are stacks of options, from Ordnance Survey maps through to watching the starry sky. On a more prosaic note, WPS is a free and comprehensive word-processor, spreadsheet and presentation program for mobiles. It can do complex tasks such as turning a document into a PDF and passing it to email. It works well with Microsoft files and offers the usual facilities, with more fonts than I will ever use.

One of the challenges of using several different devices is synchronising data. Contacts, files, browsing history and so forth from your laptop may not appear on your mobile or vice versa. However, your phone goes everywhere with you from the office to parties on the beach. Everything you want is, or could be, on your phone. Rather than synchronise, why not simplify your life to work with just one device? You could use this on the move with a portable touchscreen and keyboard – and it might even be fun.

However, phone-computing will not suit everyone. If you have specialist needs such as 3D-CAD for designing engines, or you model complex thermodynamics, then you will want something else. But if your computer use comprises online accounting, spreadsheets, Word documents, email, browsing and a few games then this may be for you. The cost is also rather competitive.

Two final thoughts: backup and security. Backup is easy, automatic and likely free. Setting up a replacement phone could automatically restore all your files; rather nice to have this prepared in advance of some desperate need. Turning to security, there are a number of hatches to close which a good security package will sort and some caution will help to maintain.

Parish Council News

A very happy, peaceful and safe New Year to everyone in the Parish!

Finance and the Parish Precept

In November's newsletter I wrote about the Parish Precept setting process. (The Parish Precept is a constituent part of your annual Council Tax.) At the December meeting the Parish Council was expected to approved its Budget and Precept level for 2023/24. The recommendation at the Finance and Administration Committee meeting on 6th Deccember was for a modest increase, well below the prevailing inflation rate, whilst maintaining a satisfactory level of reserves.

What is the Parish Council? What does it do?

Perhaps it is timely to remind you what the Parish Council is and what it does. Civil parish councils were formed in England under the reforming Local Government Act of 1894 to take over local oversight of civic duties in rural towns and villages. Each parish council's area of responsibility is a geographical area known as a civil parish; it has no connection with the Church (or the Parochial Church Council). Maresfield Parish includes the villages of Fairwarp, Maresfield and Nutley and surrounding countryside. Parish Councillors are elected every four years, the next election being in May 2023. However, casual vacancies can be filled by co-option or a by-election.

Parish councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees on Planning Applications), supporting local crime and road safety initiatives and local highway matters such as street lighting and maintenance of roadside verges. They have the power to do a large variety of things, including providing allotments, bus shelters and cemeteries and are often involved in the provision of community transport schemes, sport and recreation facilities and tourism. Parish councils can also provide a focus for representing local issues and identity.

Maresfield Parish Council has a quota of fourteen Councillors; currently we have thirteen. It is a worthwhile and satisfying role, so if you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please contact our Clerk, Nancy O'Hanlon, on 714555.



Great Spotted Woodpecker

My New Year's resolution is to try and be more positive about the future - but I already feel like banging my head repeatedly against a tree. Standing out in the street this morning, I heard a noise that reassured me that I'm not alone.

The drumming of the great spotted woodpecker is a familiar sound throughout February, surely earning this striking black and white bird the reputation as one of Britain's most famous drummers, along with Ringo Starr and Phil Collins. The bird's drumming serves an important function, because the great spotted woodpecker realises it can't sing and doesn't attempt to. Sadly, the same can't be said for Ringo and Phil. Instead, its drumroll is a percussive proclamation that hammers home the message to other male woodpeckers to stay away from its territory in the treetops. It also serves to drum up support from female woodpeckers in the vicinity who may be looking for a pied partner.

This 'song' may not be as sweet as the melodies sung by the robin or blackbird, but it still gets its message across. Indeed, the drumming can carry the bird's message across half a mile of countryside, with a male broadcasting up to 600 drumrolls

a day. Each drumroll consists of up to 10-16 beats, typically in a one-second burst. Of course, if I did attempt to take my frustrations out on a tree in a similar way, I'd suffer some form of concussion but woodpeckers are specially designed to avoid this by having shock-absorbent tissue between the base of their bill and their strengthened skulls to cushion the impact.

Their incredible beak is more than just a drumstick, it's also a pickaxe which allows them to chip away at trunks to excavate their own nest hole: and a chisel with which the woodpecker prises open tree bark to find food. That mighty beak is a formidable weapon too, which sends other birds on the peanut feeder scarpering pretty sharpish.

The great spotted woodpecker is becoming more greatly spotted, as it is a British bird which is actually increasing in numbers. The pecker's population leapt in the seventies and nineties, with some estimates stating they have increased by 300% over the past five decades. The availability of dead wood, thanks to Dutch Elm Disease, and the availability of peanuts, thanks to British bird lovers, are among of the reasons for this increase.

See, I ended the article on a positive note, maybe I won't break my New Year's resolution after all. Well done to me, I'm feeling upbeat about the future. Now to put the kettle on, put my feet up, and turn on the news...
