East Sussex services and Council tax next year



There are no new cuts to County Council services in the budget for 2024/2025.

Councillors voted for a £538 million spend on services for East Sussex in the year from 1 April. Almost three-quarters of this money goes on care and protection for the most vulnerable among our families, friends and neighbours - people who may be ill, disabled, frail or suffering neglect or abuse. The council must, by law, provide this help to those most in need.

This means there are limited resources to spend on services we all use - including roads - but councillors also agreed today to consider more spending on highways later this year. I am campaigning hard for a £5m windfall to be spent on roads.

The decision not to reduce services was taken despite the rising cost of providing them and funding not keeping pace. Councillors agreed to use a large part of the council's limited financial reserves to meet the shortfall and, reluctantly, to increase council tax for our services by 4.99% - about £1.62 a week for a typical property.

Outstanding care for children. Could you join the fostering family?

The lives of the most vulnerable children in East Sussex are improved by 'consistently strong and effective' support, an Ofsted inspection has found.

The help, protection and care children and young people are receiving from East Sussex County Council earned the authority an overall 'good' rating, while inspectors found the experiences and progress of children in care to be 'outstanding'. Much of this is thanks to the brilliant foster carers in East Sussex who give young people a loving home and the chance of a better future. They get full support from the council's fostering team and social workers to achieve these results with young people in their care.

Any of us could make great foster carers with this local support and training. If you'd like to find out more about the rewards it can bring information is on the East Sussex website.

Flexibus—boarding the bus with 10,000 passengers

Designed to help connect the most rural corners of the county to existing bus and transport services, FlexiBus helps you get to train stations, high streets, hospitals, shopping centres and more.

FlexiBus runs 7am-7pm, Monday to Saturday. Book via the Ride Pingo app, or call the team on 01273 078203 (9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday).

And don't forget that most single bus trips, on any service, cost just £2. So whether you ride a scheduled service or book a trip on FlexiBus, you can expect a convenient and low-cost journey.

District Councillor's Report, January—February 2024



Wealden has been allocated £ ½ million from the government's Rural England Prosperity Fund to support local businesses. Grants of between £2,500 and £50,000 are available but have to be matched by the business (so the more you have, the more you get). The scheme is administered by the County Council, not Wealden – apply here:

Applications can be made to the end of the year if the money lasts, but I suggest you don't wait if you're interested.

At a recent meeting of a group of 24 councils (which Wealden co-ordinates) about problems with Southern Water, OFWAT was pressured into agreeing to take a more forceful approach to regulation; in future it won't wait until services have broken down before it checks whether Southern Water has kept its promises.

I am very pleased to report that the Planning Inspector has rejected the developer's appeal about the Downlands Farm site. Her reasons were comprehensive and will discourage any further attempt to put a mass of housing on the site.

Last, but by no means least, the Council voted on Thursday 8th February to send the new draft Local Plan out to you and your fellow citizens of Wealden for consultation. The consultation period will open in early March and continue for 8 weeks. Details will be available shortly on the website and via the My Alerts email. If you can't find them, please contact me. I'll also give more detail in my next article.

Please don't comment until the consultation opens and only by using the stated methods; anything sent in by another method (e.g. to a different email address) will not be taken into account. Please send positive as well as negative comments; the more support individual policies receive, the sooner we can start to use them in making planning decisions. All comments – positive or negative – will be considered seriously once the consultation has closed and will help shape the redraft. I assure you that this will be a serious consultation, not a tickbox exercise.

A few Points and Reminders.....

Wealden's Long awaited Draft Local Plan has now been published. Meetings will be arranged in the near future, for Parishioners to give their views, which the PC will take into account when responding to Wealden in the formal consultation period. The grit in the street Grit Bins provided by the Parish Council is for use on the highway and pavements and is not for use on private paths or driveways.

The Red Telephone Kiosk in Nutley is a book exchange/lending facility so please do not place other items such as Jigsaws, Toys, Games etc in the kiosk.

We have issues around horse poo on pavements, so please, horse riders remember that horses by law should not be ridden on the pavement and drivers please, please, drive slowly past horses and give them a wide berth so that horses and riders are not put at risk if they go on the road.

Adult Gym Equipment at Fords Green, Nutley. We are considering installing some adult gym equipment behind the children's playground in Nutley. Before taking this any further we need feedback from residents as to whether this would be welcomed and used and if so what type of equipment would be preferable. Please send your thoughts and ideas on this to the Clerk at the Parish Office. clerk@maresfieldparish.org.uk

Allotments. We are expecting to have some land in Maresfield gifted to the Parish Council in the near future that will include an area for allotments. It is anticipated that preference will be given to residents of Maresfield Village when allocating the allotments and then to residents of the wider Maresfield Parish. If you would be interested in being an allotment holder please register your details with the Parish office.



The Wealden Local Plan and the Ashdown Business Park.

Wealden Council has now produced its Draft Local Plan. In some respects, it's not a bad plan but it does propose 342 new houses in Maresfield, 337 in Buxted with just 36 in Danehill, 33 in Isfield and 29 in Fletching. Overall this is too much and our local infrastructure cannot cope.

The main weakness is the Ashdown Business Park expansion which is still very much a live application. Wealden Council says over the 16 years of the Plan the area requires over 170,000 square metres of employment space. Only 85000 is identified in the Plan.

It is very difficult to see how the Plan can go ahead without the Business Park. Details of consultation arrangements will be announced soon and I urge everyone to be vigilant and register their opposition to the unacceptable parts of the plan.



The Wheatear by Michael Blencowe for Sussex Wildlife Trust

It's been a long winter, but rest assured that our summer migrant birds will soon be with us. As you read this, beating hearts and beating wings are powering tiny bodies through north African skies.

Wheatears are our earliest returning African migrants. It's a fast 3,000-mile flight from sub-Saharan Sierra Leone to Sussex for a 1-ounce Wheatear, and they've been recorded migrating at 500 miles a day. The dashing males arrive first, their soft, sun-bleached shades of pink and buff topped with a dapper black bandit's mask. At Sussex Wildlife Trust's Southerham nature reserve near Lewes, you'll see them scurrying over the grazed downland turf or perched along the valley's fence lines. When they fly, Wheatears flash the white rump which gives them their name. Because Wheatears have nothing to do with wheat or ears. Their original name...well, courtesy prevents me from writing their old English name in such an upstanding publication – but let's just say they were named after their white behinds. Victorians and vicars bird watching in mixed company blushed when they were called upon to identify one, so their name was subtly censored.

Wheatear is a more palatable name for a tragically palatable bird. In Sussex, Wheatears were considered a local delicacy and were served at the finest banquets in Lewes, Brighton and Eastbourne. Sussex shepherds would trap them to increase their income; in the late 19th Century the birds fetched 3/6d a dozen (£17.50 today). Shepherds could earn £14 per season (£1,260 today) trapping Wheatears - half their annual wage. Around the town, shepherds were eventually banned from trapping Wheatears as it distracted them from their sheep.

Gluttonous gourmets were so desperate for fresh Wheatear that they would prowl the downs and take birds straight from unmanned traps, leaving a pile of coins for the shepherds. In 1900, outspoken and outraged Sussex conservationist W.H Hudson wrote, "It is not fair that Wheatears should be killed merely to enable London stockbrokers, sporting men, and other gorgeous persons who visit the coast, accompanied by ladies with yellow hair, to feed on them at the big Brighton hotels."

But the damage was done. Trapping and the gradual loss of their sheep-grazed downland habitat caused the birds to disappear from the Sussex downs. The Wheatears we now see around Lewes unsurprisingly don't hang around. Each spring they briefly return to their old downland haunts, flash their behinds at the people of Sussex and keep on moving. From Lewes, they'll head onwards to breeding sites in northern England and northern Europe. But for some of these birds, their amazing migration continues for a further 2,000 miles across cold oceans to Greenland and Arctic Canada.




