




The Arts Society Ashdown Forest

Thursday 11 May at 2pm Through a Glass Darkly

Lecturer: Jane Gardiner

This lecture will explore the way in which artists over the centuries have included transparent glass objects in their paintings, taking huge delight in capturing the shadows and reflections seen within the glass as well as displaying their skill in portraying what lies behind and beyond. It will include the remarkable depiction of glass objects in Roman wall-paintings, works by artists such as Titian, Veronese and Caravaggio – where both the Gods of Olympus and the disciples are seen drinking out of fragile Venetian cristallo – and the proliferation of glass drinking vessels in Dutch still-life paintings.



Our lecturer has an MA in History of Art, University of London and trained at the V&A and continues to lecture there. She was Senior Lecturer at Sotheby's Institute of Art for 17 years, becoming a Deputy Director of Sotheby's, UK. Jane has also lectured for the National Trust, the Art Fund, London University, Buckingham University, l'Institut d'Etudes Superieures des Arts in Paris, a private women's college in Saudi Arabia, on cruise ships and at antiques fairs and interior design conferences in America.

New podcast highlights rare gem

Local audio producer Eka Morgan and wildlife guide Tom Forward have teamed up to produce a new podcast to celebrate Ashdown Forest.

Each episode will feature a dawn and dusk walk, as well as wider issues concerning biodiversity and, along the way, some lessons in bird songs and calls. All the interviews will be recorded outdoors, in the woods and on the heath.

The Ashdown Forest in Sussex is ten square miles of open access land and is two thirds heathland. The remaining heathland in the UK is roughly the size of the Isle of Man – this is the equivalent of one-fifth of the world's total.



With the heath come special bird species, such as the Dartford warbler and the nightjar. It is because of these birds that no new residential development is allowed within 400 metres of the Forest.

Useful features of your mobile

Mobiles are strangely slippery things. While they look modest and unassuming, they hide away features that one would never guess.

One of these features allows you to keep your phone locked to a particular app. This can be handy in circumstances such as when you are lending your phone to play a game or to look at photos but would rather that curious eyes did not start reading your messages, for example.

On Android you can do this by 'pinning' the app. Pop into your settings to search for 'pin window' and activate this feature. To choose an app to pin, tap the app switching button (bottom left corner of the screen), tap the icon of the app you want to pin and choose 'pin this app'.

You can return to the normal mode by press-and-holding the back and app-switching buttons together – they are at the bottom of the screen in the left and right corners.

iPhones have a similar feature called Guided Access which has some additional options to allow you to disable certain functions and to set a time limit. Be warned: both the iPhone and Android options require caution. For example, jam-covered nephews browsing through your snapshots could still accidentally delete photographs while looking for Aunty Marge.

Turning to WiFi passcodes – when guests arrive, one of the first questions seems to be 'can I use your WiFi?'. This is often followed by collapsing in laughter at the unpronounceable WiFi code. There is an easier way, one that bypasses the frustration when the passcode is rejected again... and again... Here is what to do.

On your already-connected Android phone, pop into the WiFi settings where you will see your WiFi network name together with a gear icon to its right. Tap the gear icon and choose 'QR Code' or 'Share'. Your guests can use their phone's camera to scan the QR code that appears. You can do the same with an iPhone via the Shortcuts app.

Another distinctly handy feature is automatic text translation. Whether you want to navigate a menu while abroad or know what you are buying from an international supermarket, instant translation is at hand. On your phone, open your browser and pop over to Google. To the right of Google's search bar you will find a camera icon. When you tap that icon, the camera will open in search mode. Simply choose 'Translate' at the bottom of the screen and take a photograph of the text you want to translate. Within a few seconds, all the guesswork is gone.

Parish Council News

Ashdown Business Park Expansion

We now understand that the current planning application for the expansion of Maresfield Business Park will not be considered by Wealden's Planning Committee North until June at the earliest, and it is possible that it could be amended.

At the end of March I, together with the Chairs of Fletching and Isfield Parish Councils, met with Ann Newton, the Leader of Wealden District Council (and the Planning Portfolio holder), when we impressed upon her the extent and depth of the opposition to the Business Park Expansion Application. A vigorous Action Group (SABRE) has been formed to fight the application and a copy of the Parish Council's Objection submission is available at maresfieldparish.org.uk.

Local Elections - Thursday 4th May

Just a reminder that the new regulations require you to produce photographic evidence of your identity when you come to the Polling Station. Our election is to elect a District Councillor to represent Maresfield ward (ie.Fairwarp, Maresfield and Nutley). Twelve valid nominations were received for the fourteen Parish Councillor vacancies in our Parish so these persons (all existing Parish Councillors) are deemed to have been elected unopposed.

Uckfield Leisure Centre

This is a popular facility used by many in our Parish.

Wealden District Council has leased the Leisure Centre from East Sussex County Council since 2002. The lease will end in July 2023. The Leisure Centre is currently managed by a leisure services provider, Freedom Leisure Limited. Wealden has decided not to extend further the current arrangements and now the County Council is considering the Leisure Centre's future.

Nightingale

My bottom desk drawer is a graveyard, the final resting place for the obsolete. A broken calculator, foreign coins, buttons and a Maxell C90 cassette given to me a few years ago. I had no means of playing it until I recently discovered my clunky cassette deck hiding in the garage.

An accompanying note says the tape contains "the song of a nightingale in the churchyard of St John sub Castro, Lewes, spring 1985". It was recorded by a lady called Barbara from an upstairs window in neighbouring Lancaster Street. After some dusting, re-wiring, buzzing and hissing, the sweet sound that swirled from my speakers transported me back over three decades to a time when Reagan negotiated with Thatcher, Paul Hardcastle's *N-n-n-Nineteen* topped the charts and a nightingale sang in St John sub Castro.

To be frank, nightingales aren't much to look at. Small brown birds; a robin without the redbreast. But when they open their beaks, there's a Susan Boyle-like transformation. These drab birds become the world's most celebrated vocalists. For centuries, poets have praised their performance. Homer, Shakespeare, Coleridge, Wordsworth, Clare, Keats, Dylan and Cohen. Shelley claimed, "A poet is a nightingale who sits in darkness, and sings to cheer its own solitude with sweet sounds". Trust young Percy Bysshe to believe the bird was wallowing in its own self-pity. The nightingale's song is actually both an aggressive war-cry and a sweet,



structured sonnet. A hymn to the silence in the hope of enticing a passing female. The nightingale's optimistic warbles have inspired everyone from the late Vera Lynn to Roxy Music. A BBC recording of a bird singing in Oxted in 1942 inadvertently captured the roar of Lancasters, Wellingtons, Stirlings and Halifaxes passing overhead laden with bombs destined for Germany. The contrast between innocence and beauty, terror and destruction make it the most powerful sound I have ever heard.

Nightingales will sing by day but are most famous for never letting up when the sun sets, their beautiful phrasing carrying loud and clear over the muffled grunts



and hoots of other nocturnal animals. Once the nightingale has hooked a partner his nocturnal performances will stop, so there's a narrow window to hear them. Our nightingales spend the winter south of the Sahara in a wide belt between Senegal and Kenya, usually returning in late April.

Due to habitat destruction the UK population of this amazing bird – so entwined in our cultural heritage – is in a steep decline. The sound of a nightingale singing in the centre of Lewes may have been relegated to the bottom drawer of history but we are blessed to still have this bird performing in our Sussex woodlands. We must never let their song of hope be silenced forever.
