The Rector writes

Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am



humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light." Matthew 11:28-30 (NLT)





County Council News

Suicide in East Sussex

Recently in my capacity as Vice Chairman of the County Council, I attended the AGM of the Eastbourne and District Samaritans. This dedicated group of people try to help those who are suicidal and spend many hours listening and helping. They emphasise listening rather than talking.

For several years, the suicide rate in East Sussex has been a bit higher than the national average but what is alarming is that the rate amongst men is much higher than women. Quite often these are young white male adults, which underlines the concern I've had for a while that their problems do not get sufficient attention.

Another alarming factor is that apparently people come to East Sussex to visit Beachy Head and the surrounding cliffs deliberately to commit suicide. The Beachy Head Chaplaincy plays a vital role in interacting with these people.

Chelwood Gate and Danehill Village Market

At the market on September 16th, there will be a visit by an East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service engine. Subject to any more urgent operational requirements the engine will be with us from 10 am to 12 noon. Firefighters will be on hand to explain the equipment and talk about their firefighting experiences.

Roads

A number of local roads are included in current programmes for maintenance and investment.

- School Lane, Danehill is due for resurfacing very soon.
- Plawhatch Lane is due for carriageway repairs in a few months.
- The Hop Garden in Fairwarp is in the programme for 'cracks and joints'.

The patching programme will include:

- London Road, Station Road and Shepherds Hill in Buxted.
- Coopers Green- A272 and London Road.
- Church Street and Ruston Bridge Road, Fletching.
- High St. Maresfield
- Chelwood Gate Road, Nutley
- Piltdown- A272 and Batts Bridge Road
- Wych Cross -A 275 and Hindleap Lane

In each case sections of the road have been identified for repairs, not the whole road. The works are planned for the next nine months so will happen gradually. More than half of the Forest's funding is for Conservation work, which is provided directly by the Government.

District Council News

I am pleased to report that Uckfield Leisure Centre has been saved from closure. Astute negotiating by senior officers has produced a new and (from our point of view) improved lease agreement with the County Council, under which the Leisure Centre has stayed open and available to the public.

Less pleasing, in respect of the Local Plan, is that the government has not relaxed the housing target it imposes on councils one little bit, let alone abolished it, contrary to what you may have heard from ill-informed politicians and journalists. It is true that the government ran a consultation earlier this year about (amongst other things) whether the straitjacket imposed by the current system should continue. This consultation closed in March. We were initially told that the government would respond in the spring, but that didn't happen and we are now told that there is no deadline for the response, and that it won't be soon. In the meantime the target applies with the same force it has had since it was introduced. Consequently, the forthcoming replacement Local Plan is having to be drafted with that target figure as the starting point, contrary to the wishes of nearly all the local people I have spoken to since becoming involved in council affairs.

Three organisations whose activities benefit our parish have had their council funding extended for another year. These are: the Ashdown Forest Conservators, Citizens' Advice and North Wealden Community Transport.

You will recall that the May elections were the first in which people voting in person had to produce ID. Whether the purpose of this change was to combat voting fraud (as the government said) or to deter certain people from voting (as its critics said), it doesn't seem to have had much effect in Wealden. The total number of voters was 28,728, which includes 20 people who were turned away as they didn't have the right ID and came back with it later. Another 18 were turned away and didn't come back. What we don't know is how many didn't try to vote, or why they didn't try.

Last, but by no means least, a lot of time has been taken up with water issues. Our parish wasn't affected by South-East Water's supply failures in June, but – from what I heard from its Chief Executive at a meeting in Wadhurst – that was more luck than judgement. The company has put forward a number of reasons or excuses for its failures, none of which is convincing, and it has become clear that it has failed to tackle its leak issues while running up substantial debt. Company representatives will be attending a meeting of the council's Overview & Scrutiny Committee on 11th September at 10 am in Hailsham. The meeting is open to the public and will be viewable online too. I'm not a member of this committee, but would be happy to pass on any questions you have for South-East Water to the Committee's Chair, Cllr Graham Shaw.

Parish Council News

Grant Application reminder

Applications should be made no later than 29th September and should be submitted to the Parish Office. A copy of the Parish Council's Grants Policy and the relevant application forms are available from the Parish Office (714555) and on the website. For this current year the Parish Council approved and has paid out 24 grants and donations, totalling some £16,000.

Playgrounds

Fords Green: Our contractor has finished the complete remodel of the children's playground at Fords Green in Nutley and it is now open for use. The new equipment and safety surface conform to the latest health and safety requirements.

Fairwarp and Parklands: New safety surfaces have also been installed at both playgrounds. These comply with health and safety and are also have good eco/sustainability credentials.

Planning Matters

The latest information from Wealden District Council is still that they are unlikely to publish their new draft Local Plan until they see clarity from the Government in respect of the new homes planning target for the District.

Meanwhile, within the Parish, the future of the land to the east of Straight Half Mile has still not been resolved. The original application in 2017 for 25 new homes and a 'community facility' on half of the site was, despite concerted opposition from the Parish Council and residents, eventually approved in a slightly modified form by Wealden in October 2020.

Subsequently new developers submitted an application for 25 homes and 12 allotments on the whole of the site and following objections this has been amended to 21 homes without the allotments. There are still major concerns, particularly about traffic, the northern access on to Straight Half Mile, the treatment of surface water drainage and the visual impacts of the proposed development from both Straight Half Mile and Nursery Lane.

This revised application contains no benefit to the Community. We await Wealden's decision.

Rose-ringed parakeet

One of my favourite quotes from *The Simpsons* comes from Springfield's vet: "I love animals. I spend my life saving them and they can't thank me. Well, the parrots can."

No animals are more famed for their ability to talk than parrots. Sure, their 'talking' is more mimicry than witty after-dinner conversation – a feathered echo chamber – but whether they're chanting 'pieces of eight' on a pirate's shoulder or swearing in front of Auntie Ethel, we humans have been entertained by their backchat for centuries.

There are around 400 species of parrot on our planet. Their native range encompasses pretty much everywhere south of the Tropic of Cancer. For us Brits their beautiful plumage embodies the

exotic; the mystery and excitement of faraway lands. So imagine my surprise when I first saw a big green parrot flying around in Sussex.

The rose-ringed (or ring-necked) parakeet looks ridiculously out of place amongst our comparatively drab starlings, wood pigeons and crows. With its garish green plumage and red beak, it stands out like a clown who has gate-crashed a funeral. And with that squawk – that incessant, demented squawk – there's no ignoring it.



South-east England's parakeets are among the world's most northerly parrot populations, but how did they get here? Some believe they made their great escape from an East London film studio in 1951, after starring alongside Bogart and Hepburn in *The African Queen*. Others claim that the Parakeets were set 'Stone Free' by Jimi Hendrix, who liberated them from their plastic cage in his girlfriend's London flat.

I rather like the idea of American sixties icons being responsible for the spread of non-native species across the UK. Perhaps Sonny and Cher smuggled grey squirrels in through customs under their furry waistcoats, or a tousle-haired Bob Dylan secretly released some American mink out of the stage door of the Albert Hall in '66.

The truth is, with tens of thousands

The truth is, with tens of thousands of parakeets being imported into the UK it was no surprise that a few slipped their chains and flew the coop.

Since the end of the sixties these free spirits have been recreating the Summer of Love across the capital. Forming feral colonies, the parakeets have filled the air with their joyous, intolerable screeching and squawking; sounds that would make Hendrix and Dylan proud. And as for free love, their blatant fornicating in London's parks has led to a parakeet population explosion. They were once established in the (sub) urban jungle of Brighton and lived in the trees of Hollingbury from 1977 until the mid-nineties. Surely it's
